Year 1 River Helford



Autumn Term

Topic

Over the term we will be exploring a range of topics to include different areas of the curriculum. We have started with our 'Knowing Me, Knowing You' topic by introducing the children to the classroom and finding out about



each other. We will then move onto 'Home Sweet Home' where we will look at different types of housing, houses from the past and drawing and designing

fantasy houses. We will be looking at materials in Science and be designing and making a room for a house in DT.



After half tem, our topic will be 'Emergency!'. In History we will focus on the Great Fire of London, Florence Nightingale and Grace Darling. We will be creating Fire of London pictures using colour washes and colour mixing. We will be creating pictures using art packages and learning to save and retrieve our work. We hope to have

lots of visits from the emergency services.

In RE there will be a focus on 'What is the Church?' and we hope to arrange a visit to Holy Trinity Church. The term will end with a celebration of Christmas and looking at the story of the birth of Jesus.

Maths

Our Maths for this term builds on the children's existing understanding in counting, calculating and shape and measure. In Year One, we will be using workbooks based on the 'Shanghai approach' to maths. This allows us to explore mathematical concepts in visual ways, with a focus on applying our knowledge to a range of problems. We also have

lots of practical experiences to enhance understanding of new concepts.

English

Our English work this term will be closely matched with our topic work. Within this, we will be

concentrating on forming and writing a series of sentences, using capital letters and full stops and using our knowledge of phonics and high frequency words in reading and spelling. We will be writing our own stories, instructions, traditional tales and poetry. In Year One we also have weekly spelling tests based on the phonic we have learned that week.

Phonics

Our phonics work continues to build on the children's previous learning in this area. We will be consolidating the children's understanding of the 44 phonemes, and the letters which represent each of the sounds. We will be practicing 'breaking words up into sounds' to support the children's independent writing, and 'putting sounds together' to support their independent reading. We also begin to look at alternative spellings and pronunciation to enable us to be ready for the phonics screening in June.

Guided reading

Alongside the reading within our English sessions, the children will be supported with their reading through a daily guided reading roundabout. They will have an opportunity to read through a text with an adult, and discuss elements of the text together as a group. They will also share their reading books with Junior reading partners.

Handwriting

This term, we will continue to practise our cursive letter formation. We are now learning how to join these letters together..
