What is a Specialist base?



A Specialist base is a specialist provision located within a mainstream school. It is designed for learners whose needs cannot be fully met through ordinarily available provision alone, but who benefit from being part of a mainstream school community.

A Specialist base combines specialist teaching, tailored support and therapeutic approaches with opportunities for pupils to learn, socialise and participate alongside their mainstream peers wherever appropriate. Each learner has an individual programme based on their strengths, needs and aspirations, enabling them to access learning in a way that is right for them.

The aim of a Specialist base is to provide the best of both worlds: the expertise and personalised support of a specialist setting, alongside the opportunities, relationships and experiences that come from being part of a mainstream school.

Every Specialist base is different and is designed to meet the needs of a specific group of learners. At our school, the provision focuses on supporting learners with speech, language and communication needs and/or autism.

Our Specialist base provides:

- Specialist teachers and highly trained support staff.
- Individualised learning programmes based on each child's Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) outcomes.
- Access to therapeutic approaches and specialist professionals where appropriate.
- Small-group and individual teaching alongside opportunities for inclusion in mainstream lessons and school life.
- A nurturing environment that promotes communication, independence, wellbeing and confidence.
- Close partnership working with families and external professionals to achieve the very best outcomes.

Our ambition is for every learner to feel that they belong, develop meaningful relationships, achieve academically and personally, and gain the knowledge, skills and confidence they need for adulthood. Through high expectations, specialist support and inclusive practice, we enable every pupil to thrive as a valued member of our school community.

Uniform + Equipment



At our Specialist base, we follow the same uniform policy as the wider school. This is to ensure everyone looks smart and feels part of the school community. We believe that wearing the uniform with pride helps create a positive and respectful learning environment.

Our uniform is:

- white polo shirt
- blue sweatshirt/cardigan
- black or grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- grey or white socks, black or grey tights
- black shoes – no trainers
- optional - school fleece
- optional – blue/white check summer dress for Easter to end of October

PE kit:

- white t shirt
- black shorts
- trainers or plimsolls
- optional – school tracksuit
